Training activities

Training and assessment are conducted:

Classroom – Training and assessment take place in a classroom and involves discussions, presentations, role plays and simulated activities.

Self-directed learning – Further study and assessment activities are done by participants in their own time.

Assessment activities

Assessment will be carried out throughout the duration of the qualification. Feedback will be given to participants by their Assessor as they progress through the qualification.

The ways in which assessment activities are conducted may include:

- Written/oral questioning
- Projects
- Observations
- Scenarios and role plays
- Third party reports Prior Learning (RPL)

Recognition of prior learning
