DO I NEED PREVIOUS EXPERIENCE?

There are no essential prerequisites but you may find it an advantage to have a Certificate III in Individual Support and at least six months of industry experience, or a Certificate III in Individual Support (Ageing or HAC).

CAN I FAST-TRACK THE COURSE?

Yes, we will acknowledge your previous skills and experience and shorten the course if you:

- ✓ Have been working in the industry for more than two years.
- ✓ Have previous qualifications issued by other educational institutions that have been completed in full and match the course units.

We can also shorten the course by reducing your work placement if you currently work in the industry, for example, a respite centre, aged care facility or disability service and can provide a letter from your employer stating the role and hours you currently work.
