Most recently, she lead BHC's involvement in the Queensland Government's Housing Investment Fund, securing partnerships with the private sector with the intent of growing the supply of social and affordable housing by up to 1,200 homes in South East Queensland.

Rebecca is the Deputy Chair of the national Community Housing Industry Association, Director of UDIA Queensland, a former Board member of Queensland Shelter, a Graduate of the Australian Institute of Company Directors and recipient of the 2018 UDIA Women in Leadership Award. A passionate advocate for the sector, she has presented at national, state and local housing forums on a range of affordable housing issues.
